## **Mayor Jacobs Talks About Green Waste Collections, Senior Centers, Parks and Recreation, and Emergency Management Agency**

*KNOXVILLE, Tenn.*— During his Weekly Update, which will be posted at 3 p.m. today, Knox County Mayor Glenn Jacobs talks about the county’s one-time assistance program to help homeowners remove green waste (trees, limbs, and brush) generated from private property during the tornado that hit the area two weeks ago.

Mayor Jacobs also shared a reminder that Knox County Parks and Recreation will host its second annual Glow Party at Ball Camp Park from 8:30-10:30 p.m. tonight.

Additionally, Mayor Jacobs encourages folks to sign up for the emergency warning system by at [knoxcounty.org/alert](http://knoxcounty.org/alert) or by calling 311. The system sends alerts via text, email, or a phone call during emergency situations.

He also touches on senior centers, Liberty Place, the Tennessee Air National Guard, and the Knoxville-Knox County Emergency Management Agency’s new unified mobile command truck.
