Five Points Up coalition hosts second annual Winter Wonderland event

Knoxville, Tenn. — Five Points Up invites the public to its second annual Winter Wonderland program on Thursday, Dec. 3 from 6 to 7:30 p.m. at Dr. Walter Hardy Park, 2020 Martin Luther King Jr. Ave.

"Winter Wonderland is an opportunity to create a positive and engaging atmosphere for community members to fellowship and enjoy a festive occasion," said Tanisha Baker, Five Points Up member and Project Grad Knoxville college/career access feeder team leader.

The purpose of the program is to build relationships among neighbors in East Knoxville and inform community members of available services. The free event is open to the public and will feature caroling, dancing and food. Vendors, including the City of Knoxville's 3-1-1 and 2-1-1 Call Center, Pellissippi State Community College, the Knox County Health Department (KCHD) and others, will be located inside Tabernacle Baptist Church across the street from Dr. Walter Hardy Park.

The mission of Five Points Up, a community-led group facilitated by KCHD, is to beautify and unify East Knoxville through community-based activities and events. The group hopes to improve the health of those living and working in the area by increasing the sense of community. According to the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, promoting meaningful community participation builds trust and relationships among neighbors, empowering them to become advocates for their communities. Neighborhood involvement helps communities reach health-related goals and empowers residents to adopt behaviors that improve health outcomes.

In 2010, KCHD secured grant funding from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation to engage three at-risk neighborhoods to address environmental barriers to good health. KCHD is continuing this evidenced-based work in Five Points and other targeted neighborhoods, in part, by providing staff support and facilitation to neighborhood organizations.
