KCHD hosts Community Supported Agriculture Fair

"By creating another opportunity for our community to meet its local farmers and purchase their produce, we're not only increasing access to fresh fruits and vegetables, we're also helping the local economy by supporting our farmers," said KCHD Program Manager Fiona McAnally.

Attendees will have the opportunity to meet more than 10 local farmers and learn about their CSA programs, which provide a way for consumers to buy local, seasonal produce directly from a farmer.
