World AIDS Day commemorated December 1, 2015

KCHD urges everyone to get tested at least once in their lifetime

Knoxville, Tenn. – Observed worldwide on Dec. 1 since 1998, World AIDS Day is the moment when millions of people come together to commemorate those who have lost their lives to HIV, applaud progress made in responding to the epidemic and recommit to eradicating the disease.

"Tremendous scientific strides offer hope of a brighter future for those living with HIV. Now, more than ever, it is crucial that those infected with HIV get tested and get medical care," said Knox County Health Department (KCHD) Director Dr. Martha Buchanan. "Early detection and care can save lives."

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) estimates more than 1.1 million Americans aged 13 years and older are living with HIV infection, including 180,900 who are unaware of their infection. Everyone aged 13 to 64 is encouraged to get tested for HIV at least once. Although there is no cure, getting medical care and taking medicines regularly helps those infected live longer, healthier lives and also lowers the chances of passing HIV on to others.

HIV testing is covered as a preventive service with no co-pay by most insurance plans. KCHD offers resources and local referral information to medical providers who want information on how to start the conversation with patients. Confidential HIV testing is also available at all three KCHD locations:
